THE COURSING ABILITY TEST (CAT)

The Coursing Ability Test (CAT) is a pass/fail event. Dogs run singularly. In order to pass, the dog must complete the course with enthusiasm and without interruption within the maximum amount of time for the course length. The judge keeps the official time and decides the merits of the dog's performance. *A dog that relieves itself on course shall fail the test.*

It is safest for dogs to run "naked" which means they do not wear a collar. However, dogs may wear any collar except a choker collar, a collar with prongs or an electronic training collar. The collar should be snug to minimize the chances of getting hung up on something during the run. Owners should be aware that there is a chance that tags hanging from the collar could become entangled on something during the run. *The test committee may, at its discretion, require hanging collar tags to be secured to the collar with tape or in some other manner.* Owners may use clips or rubber bands to hold the dog's hair. The owner assumes responsibility for the safety of the dog with regard to the dog's collar and paraphernalia on the dog.

For the safety of the dog and as a courtesy to other exhibitors, your dog should have a reliable recall.

HOW TO ENTER

- Pre-entry: mail completed entry form and payment to the Test Secretary.
- Gate entry: bring entry form and payment to the event before close of entries.
- Checks should be made payable to: Iowa Coursing Association.
- If you have questions about how to enter, contact the Test Secretary.
- Pre-entries will be acknowledged by e-mail provided a legible e-mail address is included on the entry form.

ENTRY FEES

Pre-entry: \$20 per dog per test.

Gate entry: \$25 per dog per test.

Junior Handler*: \$15 per dog per test (pre-entry or gate entry)

** A Junior is defined as anyone younger than 18 years of age. The Junior must handle/release the dog in the CAT to qualify for the reduced entry fee. Juniors should apply for and receive an AKC Junior Handler Number prior to test day. Junior Handler Certification forms will be available from the Test Secretary. If the dog is entered under this provision but the Junior does not handle/release the dog, the owner must pay the regular entry fee as published in the premium.*

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Separate entry forms and entry fees are required for each dog for each event entered.
2. A fee of \$40.00 will be assessed for any returned checks.
3. Incomplete, unsigned, conditional, or unpaid entries will not be accepted.
4. Run order will be determined by Random Draw.
5. Pre-entries must be received by the Test Secretary by the pre-entry deadline listed on the front cover of this premium list.
6. Gate entries will be accepted if the entry limit listed on the front of this premium is not reached with pre-entries.
7. The Club and/or Test Secretary assume no responsibility for wrong or incomplete information given on the entry form.
8. Dogs must be ready for judging. Judges need not wait for dogs that hold up the test.
9. The Club and/or the Test Secretary assume no responsibility for injury or a dog's failure to recall.
10. At the discretion of the Test Chairman, there may be a \$5.00 fine assessed for any loose dog on the field not taking part in the course in progress.
11. Any person, upon reasonable complaint, may be asked to leave the grounds by the field committee. Children must be under the control of their parents or guardian at all times.
12. Only the lure operator, huntmaster, judges and handlers of the course in progress will be permitted near the lure operating equipment.
13. No substitution of entries if the test(s) fill prior to the pre-entry deadline.

ROLL CALL & INSPECTION

AM Event: Inspection begins at 8:00AM and ends at 9:00AM.

PM Event: Inspection begins at 1:00PM and ends at 2:00PM.

** Early acceptance of dogs for members of the field committee may begin one-half hour prior to published test hours.*

Being inspected satisfies roll call. Dogs not present at the time of inspection will be scratched if not present by the time the first CAT dog runs.

Each entry will be inspected for lameness, fitness to compete, and females in season. If in the opinion of the inspection committee, any entry found to be lame, unfit to safely compete, or a female in season, that dog shall not be allowed to enter and entry fees shall be refunded; bitches in season shall be removed from the test site.

PRE-COURSE BRIEFING

A pre-course briefing will be held prior to the beginning of the CAT.

COURSE DISTANCE & QUALIFYING TIMES

Safety of the dogs is of the utmost importance. Dogs will run one of the course distances listed below. Veteran dogs may be allowed to run two-thirds of the normal distance at the owner's discretion. For the purpose of CAT tests, veteran dogs are defined as dogs over 7 years of age. The owner must declare prior to the start of the dog's run which distance the dog will run. Veteran dogs completing the shorter course will continue to earn legs toward the current CAT titles.

- 300 yard course for dogs that are shorter than 12 inches at the withers and/or brachycephalic ("flat-faced"). A veteran dog may run 200 yards at the owner's discretion. The course must be completed in less than 1.5 minutes.
- 600 yard course for all dogs that do not run the 300 yard course. A veteran dog may run 400 yards at the owner's discretion. The course must be completed in less than 2 minutes.

If there is a question which course a dog should run, the judge will decide. Time ends when the dog completes the course, not when the dog is leashed.

ELIGIBILITY

CATs are open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are registered/enrolled with the AKC in one of the following ways:

- individually registered with the AKC
- recorded in the Foundation Stock Service (FSS) program
- individually registered with a foreign or domestic registry organization whose pedigrees are acceptable for AKC registration
- dogs granted a Purebred Alternative Listing (PAL) number
 - Information on getting your dog a PAL number can be found here: www.akc.org/register/purebred-alternative-listing
- dogs with AKC Limited or Conditional Registration
- mixed breed dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners (CP) program.
 - Information about getting your dog a CP number can be found here: www.apps.akc.org/classic/mixbreeds/listing_info.cfm
- Dogs with breed disqualifications and monorchid/cryptorchid dogs are eligible to participate.
- Females in season may not enter.
- A dog may enter only once per event (test).

AWARDS

Each dog that passes the test will receive a ribbon that is orange in color. Each dog that earns a new CA or CAA will receive a new title rosette.*

Each dog that earns a new CAX will receive a special new CAX rosette.*

** Please let the Test Secretary know if your dog could possibly earn a new title at our event so we have enough rosettes on hand.*

TITLES

Dogs can earn three titles by passing the Coursing Ability Test the required number of times. These are suffix titles that will appear on a dog's pedigree with a higher level title superseding a lower level title.

- Coursing Ability (CA) – Awarded to a dog that passes the Coursing Ability Test three times under at least two different judges.
- Coursing Ability Advanced (CAA) - Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test a total of ten times.
- Coursing Ability Excellent (CAX) – Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test a total of 25 times. Coursing Ability Excellent 2 (CAX2) – Dog passes the Coursing Ability Test a total of 50 times. A higher numbered title will be awarded for every additional twenty five passes.

TIPS FOR HANDLERS

1. The field is not securely fenced. It is strongly recommended that prior to running your dog, you have good recall control over your dog, as the dogs will run off leash.
2. Handlers should wear comfortable, sturdy shoes (no sandals or flip flops) and be physically able to hold and release their dogs, as well as catch them.
3. Handlers may carry toys, whistles or small treats to reward and assist with retrieving their dog at the completion of their run. Treats may not be excessive to the point of distracting other dogs.
4. Dogs will be brought to the start line on leash and released only upon a verbal signal ("Tally-Ho!") from the Huntmaster. Dogs may be released by hand, folded leash, or traditional lure coursing lead.
5. The Huntmaster will instruct the handler to "Retrieve your dog" upon completion of the run. The handler is expected to promptly secure the dog and leave the field with the dog on leash.
6. Handlers are advised to warm up their dogs prior to their run and walk them for 10 minutes afterwards.
7. Coursing is a physically demanding sport and can tax a dog's physical strength. Dogs that are old, have breathing or heart problems, are overweight, or are out of condition may be at greater risk for injury and exhaustion. Consult your veterinarian if you have concerns
8. Muzzles are not required but are permitted at the handler's discretion.

Via I-35 from the North:

- Continue onto I-235W
- Use Right two lanes to take Exit 7 for Keo Way/19th St
- Keep Left at the fork; Follow signs for MLK Pkwy/Airport
- Drive for 6 miles on MLK Pkwy/Fleur Drive
- Turn Right on Grays Lake Drive
- Follow Grays Lake Drive until you reach the Field; there will be signs posted.

Via I-35 from the South:

- Take Exit 68 for IA-5 towards W Des Moines/Norwalk
- Take Exit 99 for Norwalk
- Turn Left onto IA-28N
- Turn Right onto Army Post Rd
- Turn Left onto Fleur Drive
- Turn Left onto Grays Lake Drive
- Follow Grays Lake Drive until you reach the Field; there will be signs posted.

Via I-80 from the West:

- Continue onto I-235E
- Take Exit 7A onto MLK Pkwy towards Airport
- Drive for 6 miles on MLK Pkwy/Fleur Drive
- Turn Right on Grays Lake Drive
- Follow Grays Lake Drive until you reach the Field; there will be signs posted.

Via I-80 from the East:

- Use left lane to take Exit 137A to merge onto I-235W
- Use Right two lanes to take Exit 7 for Keo Way/19th St
- Keep Left at the fork; Follow signs for MLK Pkwy/Airport
- Drive for 6 miles on MLK Pkwy/Fleur Drive
- Turn Right on Grays Lake Drive
- Follow Grays Lake Drive until you reach the Field; there will be signs posted.
